Renee Gelin After losing her son to a devastating unnecessary adoption, Renee discovered her purpose – to help other mothers preserve their families. Renee started speaking to other expectant mothers and realized that many of the reasons that they were considering adoption, were similar to hers – temporary. She started to explain the lifelong trauma that maternal separation causes both the mothers and their newborns and the mothers were listening. Many in the adoption community began to support her efforts of family preservation. Others online began to direct mothers considering adoption to speak with Renee and the concept of **Saving Our Sisters** became a reality. Renee married her son's father and together they parent their 2 daughters in Florida.



Kathryn Joyce is an investigative reporter at Salon covering the political right, education, women's rights and child welfare issues. She's the author of *The Child Catchers: Rescue, Trafficking and the New Gospel of Adoption* and *Quiverfull: Inside the Christian Patriarchy Movement*. Christopher Emmanuel founded Sky Is The Limit in 2015. His daughter was involved in an unethical and predatory adoption without his consent in February 2014; however, he was able intervene and prove himself because he registered on The South Carolina Responsible Father Registry. Despite the obstacles and structural impediments he faced as a father he was successful in bringing his daughter home. Now as a single father, through his triumph and the lessons of fatherhood, he has taken on a role of being a Father Practitioner. Educating and empowering fathers to cultivate responsibility and family values.



Leslie Pate Mackinnon has maintained a private psychotherapy practice for four decades. She resides in Asheville and presents both nationally and internationally on issues that impact families conceived through adoption and third-party reproduction. Kara Rubinstein Deyerin is a non-practicing attorney with an LLM in Taxation. She is a mom, wife, writer, cook, Jew, knitter, and connoisseur of all things human. In January 2018, she wanted to see where in Africa her father's family came from. An over-the-counter DNA test revealed the man on her birth certificate wasn't her genetic father. She lost her bi-racial identity with the click of a mouse. The DNA pandora's box she opened led to an identity crisis. She co-founded Right to Know, a non-profit that supports people impacted by DNA surprises and misattributed parentage experiences (MPE) which can occur due to an adoption, assisted conception, or those conceived from a non-paternal event (NPE) as well as those searching for genetic family through education, mental health, and advocacy. Right to Know promotes understanding of the complex intersection of genetic information, identity, and family dynamics.



Marcie Keithley is a birth mom in reunion since 2008 with her daughter Jesse. She is also the co founder of the **National Association of Adoptees and Parents** where she serves as President and Host of *Adoption Happy Hour*, a weekly Friday night virtual event with a global attendance from the adoption constellation. Keithley is also the author of "The Shoebox Effect: Transforming Pain into Fortitude and Purpose" as well as a children's book, "Frankie and Friends Talk Adoption." She resides in Southern Indiana and is owned by one sassy doodle, Murfee.



Macy Oosthuizen (pronounced wist-hay-zen) is a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) and is the founder of Finding Spaces Therapy in Jupiter, FL.
